The Judicial Power is charged of administering justice in order to ensure the respect, protection and supervision of rights recognized under the Constitution and laws. Its higher organ is the , which is composed of 16 judges appointed by the .

The Dominican Republic has a multi-party political system with national elections every four years. In two rounds of presidential elections in 1996, nearly 80% of eligible Dominican voters went to the polls. The leading parties in 1994 were the .

Political System in the Dominican Republic

The Legislative power is developed in the National Congress formed by the Senate, compound by 32 senators representing the 31 Dominican districts plus the National District; and the Chamber of Deputies. All are chosen as well by popular vote to perform their functions for 4 years.

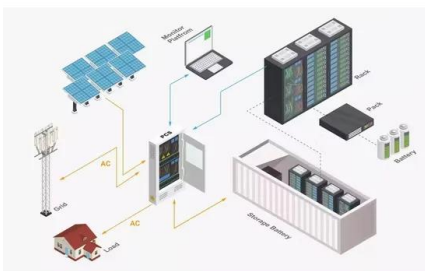
