Mauritania: AfDB Invests \$289.5M in Solar Power Projects

The PIEMM project comprises the construction of solar power facilities and a 1,373-km, 600 MW high-voltage power line connecting Mauritania and Mali. The initiative is financed by a \$272 million loan from the African Development Fund - the concessional window of the AfDB - and a \$1.5 million grant from the United Nations-led Green Climate Fund.

Mauritania: Over \$289 million in financing to develop solar power

The first project, the PIEMM, involves building a 225 kV electricity interconnection to link Mauritania to Mali as part of the Desert to Power Initiative. The program will develop solar power plants and establish a 1,373-kilometer high-voltage power line, with a transit capacity of 600 megawatts (MW) between the two countries.



Nouakchott solar plant 50 MW

This 50 MW solar energy plant, funded by both the Mauritanian government and the Arabic Fund for Economic and Social Development with a \$53 million investment, is made up of 540 panels and a 33-kVA transformation station. The plant not only expands access to electricity in the country, but also promotes the use of clean, green energy.

Sheikh Zayed Solar Power Plant, a 15 MW facility in Nouakchott, is the first utility-scale one in Mauritania. It provides 10% of the country's grid capacity, producing 25,409 MWh of clean energy and reducing 21,225 tonnes of CO2 emissions annually. Its 30,000 solar panels, manufactured by Masdar PV, supply power to over 10,000 homes in the capital.

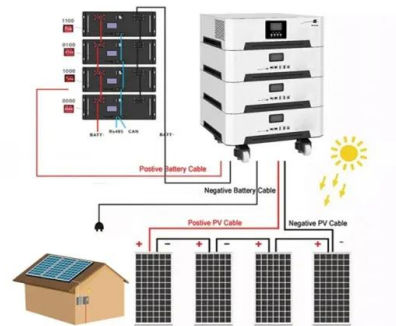

Mauritania: 50MW solar project

The Toujounine photovoltaic power plant is helping Mauritania achieve its 20% renewable energy target by producing 10% of the country's total electricity production in 2019. With 156,000 solar panels and an installed capacity of 50 MW, it is the largest photovoltaic plant in Mauritania, generating around 87 GWh annually.
