Macao power station () is an operating power station of at least 28-megawatts (MW) in Taipa, Macao, Macao with multiple units, some of which are not currently operating. It is also known as Macao power station.

Voltage in Macau

While CEM has three ageing fossil-fuelled power stations, one located on the Macau peninsula and two on Coloane Island, they are only able to deliver 472 MW, representing today a mere 9% of the administrative regions total power



requirements. For the remaining 91% of demand, Macau has to rely on imports from the Chinese Mainland.
